

STANDING ORDERS OF THE BRITISH WHEEL OF YOGA

1. MOTIONS

All motions must be submitted in writing with the names and signatures of the proposer and seconder. An explanatory note is to be attached. No seconder is required for motions submitted by the Executive Committee

Motions designed to alter the constitution and bye laws must be submitted to the Honorary General Secretary no later than 10th October for publication in the Winter Issue of the magazine.

All other motions for the Annual General Meeting must be submitted by 10th January for publication in the Spring Issue of the magazine

Voting for all motions shall be by secret ballot on an official ballot paper and in the method as set out in the Bye Laws (4. Elections and Voting)

2. CONDUCT OF MEETINGS

The Chairman's decision on all points is final.

Motions: Time Allowed for speakers:

Proposer 3 Minutes

Secunder 1 Minute

Each subsequent speaker 2 Minutes

The Proposer of the motion shall have right of reply at the close of debate (3 Minutes).

The motions for closure or next business may be proposed and seconded only by members who have not spoken in the debate. The Chairman shall (unless in his/her opinion the motion has not been sufficiently debated) put to the vote, by show of hand, for closure or next business, as the case may be. A two-thirds majority is needed to carry this.

In matters of urgency, the Chairman may accept a motion for suspension of Standing Orders provided that:

a) - The member states his/her reason for suspension

b) - No less than two thirds of members present and eligible to vote agree by a show of hands.
